Effective Strategies for Improving Morale

Supervising employees has always been challenging especially in today's economic times. Working in the public school setting these challenges are not diminished. Across the country public building are becoming community owned. Expectations and a sense of entitlement pushes facilities to the extreme. We are asked to stay open longer, provide more spaces for events that educational facilities weren't designed for, and to do so at no cost to the public.

As facilities become community centers, evening event locations for students, young children, and senior citizens taxes our budgets and staff. Maintaining positive morale becomes a near impossible task.

Union contracts seem to take longer to settle, building usage causes a sense that we are no longer in control of our facilities, and saying no to people is no longer appropriate. This control issue more than any other seems to bring down morale. This wholesale change in how facilities are operated appears to be a cultural change here to stay. Unfortunately most institutions hadn't planned for the fallout or consequences it causes.

One strategy I've found can bring some relief in maintaining or raising morale; modernizing equipment and keeping up with the newest technology that impact cleaning and maintenance. Battery operated tools, safer cleaning chemicals, lighter smaller equipment, and multifunctional equipment are just a few examples. Be sure to ask you peers how they tackle these problems, remember it is easier to steal good ideas than to think of them yourselves.

Though this process seems simple asking staff to change procedures or replace tools and equipment requires buy-in or the process can be stopped before ever getting started. Finding staff who embrace change and trust your decisions are key! Sometimes staff will believe that the current equipment is already working just fine and they aren't interested in changing. Vacuuming is an area that can be a real challenge when considering switching to new equipment. This is where depending on your vendor can help. Try performing a time trial in a side by side comparison using a stop watch. Invite staff to participate cleaning spaces that are dirty and have them perform at their usual pace.

These strategies can be time consuming so lean on your vendors, ask questions, and listen to your staff before making changes and you will find that both morale and efficiency will improve.
