



CERTIFIED PLANT MAINTENANCE MANAGER (CPMM) TRAINING OFFERED

The MNCEG is again offering this training opportunity for our members. Training class and exam will be held at IEA offices in Brooklyn Park Wednesday, January 31 through Friday, February 2, 2018. The format for the certification course will be: Study sessions from 8:00 am - 4:30 pm on January 31 and February 1, and a short review session followed by testing on February 2 from 8:00 am - 1:00 pm.

The CPMM Certification is for those who currently work in the facilities field, and would like to build on their specific competencies within the field of maintenance management.

OBJECTIVES OF THE CPMM PROGRAM

- To provide a standard of professional competence in the field of plant/facilities maintenance management.
- To identify and recognize those individuals who by passing an examination and fulfilling requirements of experience, responsibility and conduct meet that standard.
- To encourage plant/facility supervisory professionals in a continuing program of professional development.
- To stimulate and provide a standard for the development of educational curricula and degree programs for plant/facility maintenance professionals.
- To enhance the status of the plant/facilities profession as a unique discipline & profession by demonstrating that a realistic standard of professional competence can be clearly defined.

MN CHIEF ENGINEERS GUILD BY THE NUMBERS

The MNCEG is growing! The number of Members and Associate Members has grown from **344** in 2015, **395** in 2016, to **431** in 2017 – a **25%** increase in 2 years!

Who Are Our Members?

118 members from the Minnesota State Colleges and University system with representation from 21 State Colleges, Universities, and Technical Colleges plus Minnesota State Central Office;

89 members from the Department of Corrections with representation from 9 Correctional Facilities and the MN Department of Corrections Central Office;

74 members from the Department of Human Services with representation from 7 facilities and DHS Central Office;

13 members from the Minnesota Department of Veterans Affairs with representation from 4 facilities;

51 members from various public entities such as the Department of Administration - State Capitol Complex, Department of Commerce, Department of Labor & Industry, Department of Transportation, Minnesota Zoo, cities, counties, and school districts.



The State Capitol Restoration Tour was a really special event for the MN Chief Engineers Guild and a perfect way to kick off the celebration of our 75th Anniversary.

Project Overview: Chris Guevin, Capitol Complex Facility Manager, Sarah Berseth from HGA Architects, and Jason McMillen from JE Dunn Construction put on a high quality educational program, with an eye-opening look at the complexities of this monumental restoration project.

STATE CAPTOL TOUR

State Capitol Tour: Special thanks to the Minnesota Historical Society and the Capitol Facilities Management Staff for the informative tour of the State Capitol.



FASCINATING FACTS ABOUT THE STATE CAPITOL RESTORATION PROJECT

- Restoration project took 40 months (August 2013 December 2016) and cost \$310 million
- \$9 million of construction completed per month / \$450,000 per day
- Over 100 subcontractors and suppliers from all over the country and world
- Scaffolding used to refurbish the rotunda weighed 250,000 pounds; was 120 feet high, 60 feet in diameter
- 15 new air handling units and 750,000 pounds of new ductwork installed during the project
- 7.3 miles of conduit and 208 miles of branch wiring for lighting and outlets; 5,463 new light fixtures installed
- 763 existing historic light fixtures removed, tagged, refurbished, and reinstalled
- 30,000 marble pieces marked and cataloged and an estimated 20,000 marble repairs completed
- 800 tons of white Georgia marble used, quarried from the same county in Georgia as in 1905


