

ANNUAL CONFERENCE KEYNOTE AND CAPSTONE ADDRESSES

Be sure to attend our Keynote and Capstone presentations at the Annual Conference and hear two knowledgeable and dynamic speakers provide insight on leadership and life skills.

<u>Keynote:</u> "Top 20s Use Top 20 Thinking: How Our Thinking Governs Our Experience", Willow Sweeney, Top 20 Training, Wednesday, September 6, 2017, 11:00 am-12:15 pm.

REGISTER NOW FOR THE 2017 MNCEG ANNUAL CONFERENCE!




Thanks to everyone who has already registered for the MNCEG Annual Conference, being held at Breezy Point Conference Center September 6-8, 2017.



UNIVERSITY OF MN MAIN ENERGY PLANT (MEP) TOUR PLANNED FOR JANUARY 2018

The MN Chief Engineers Guild is planning a tour of the Main Energy Plant at the University of Minnesota for early January 2018. The University is reinvesting in the former "Old Main Heating Plant," replacing old boilers with a new 22.8 megawatt combustion turbine and heat recovery system that will generate electric power and steam for the Minneapolis campus. Fueled by natural gas, the Main Energy Plant is a key investment in the University's climate action plan to reduce campus emissions by half by the year 2020.
