


75th ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION



As a lasting tribute to the MN Chief Engineers Guild 75th Anniversary, the Executive Board submitted a request to the Office of Governor Mark Dayton to issue a Proclamation to honor the members of the Guild and to commemorate the 75th Anniversary of the Guild.

The proclamation was unveiled at the Conference Banquet Thursday night, with some help from a group of teachers from Brainerd Schools who serenaded banquet attendees with marching band music!

Below is the text of the proclamation:

WHEREAS: The Minnesota Chief Engineers Guild, established in 1943, is an association of employees in the State of Minnesota actively engaged in the planning, management, and maintenance of public facilities, grounds, equipment and systems; and

WHEREAS: The Minnesota Chief Engineers Guild's mission is to inspire stewardship of public facilities through education, collaboration, and promotion of best management practices; and

WHEREAS: The members of the Minnesota Chief Engineers Guild are dedicated facilities management professionals, entrusted with effectively maintaining the large inventory of existing public facilities, bringing new buildings online, and providing responsible stewardship of Minnesota's public assets; and

WHEREAS: Through continuous learning and development of expertise in the field of facilities management, members of the Minnesota Chief Engineers Guild help improve the efficiency of our buildings operations, ensure higher performance of public buildings through energy efficiency, life-cycle costing, and other best practices for facilities management; and



WHEREAS: The personnel who quietly manage the fixed assets of our communities are among the unsung heroes of the State of Minnesota and deserve a day of recognition and acknowledgement for the countless hours spent ensuring the effective operation of our State.

NOW, THEREFORE, I MARK DAYTON, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Friday, September 7, 2018, as:
