CERTIFIED PLANT MAINTENANCE MANAGER (CPMM) CERTIFICATION



CPMM Certification is for those who are currently work in the facilities field, and would like to build on their specific competencies within the field of maintenance management.

The study and testing session will be held at Institute for Environmental Assessment (IEA), 9201 West Broadway, Suite 600, Brooklyn Park. Study sessions will be on February 3 and 4, with a short review session followed by testing on February 5. More information about the training and exam including registration instructions and cost will be sent out in December.


