

This year \$10,000 was awarded in scholarships as part of the Minnesota Chief Engineers Guild Scholarship Program. This program provides scholarships for individuals enrolled in post-secondary educational institutions. Scholarships applications are accepted during the summer, and awards are made each fall, with the official announcement made at the MnCEG Fall Conference.

The Scholarship Program is funded through events and contributions. The primary fundraiser is the annual Dollars for Scholars Golf Tournament, held in June each year. Money is also raised at an event at the fall conference. All proceeds from both of these events go directly to scholarships. Contributions are also an important source of funding for the program.
